Reasons for Choice:

Wanted to get back into education and gain a useful qualification, it is over 15 years since I did any form of formal tuition and needed to prove to myself that I was still capable of learning.

Needed a subject which was relevant to my job so it was something that was broadly familiar, and to gain funding and study release from my company.
Local study centre was essential with study hours that could be fitted around work and home.

How relevant was the course?

The subject content covered all elements of packaging that I encounter in my job and several that I do not. Unfamiliar processes were well explained and understanding gained to the required level and beyond.

Different course members were also able to supply example materials, samples and training resources from within their organisations which would not normally be available.
